AWARDS 2018-19

President's Trophy – ROOKIE OF THE YEAR – Donated by Rick Libbey, President 1979-80, this award is given to a deserving new member upon completion of their first full year as a club member. This recipient has been actively engaged from the time of initiation sharing the huge task of linen inventory, laundering, and storage. She has been active in catering, baking, Canteen Auction and a wide variety of club projects.

The Rookie of the Year trophy is presented to Civitan Marion McCartney.

President -Elect's Trophy – OUTSTANDING PROJECT AWARD – Donated by Civitan Paul Cooney, this award is presented annually to the Civitan(s), judged by the Awards Committee, to have organized the most outstanding project during the past year. The criteria may include: amount of organization required, number of workers involved, amount of net proceeds, number of people attending, community involvement, or number of other organizations involved.

The Outstanding Project Award is presented to **Pie Days** Together, the Thanksgiving and Christmas project demanded over 60 volunteers – both Civitan and friends of Civitan – those who picked up apples, washed apples, pastry makers, rollers, apple peelers, apple peeler fixers, apple pie makers and fillers, crimpers, apple crisp makers, apple sauce makers, spice measurers, onion mincers, tourtiere cooks, truckers of meat to cool off and back to fillers, cherry pie fillers, labellers, packers, runners, counters, sales table folk, those who phoned to remind, the on-line and phone message retrievers, lunch providers and those who sold pies and crisps - 1157 orders were sold this year raising over \$10,000. Membership Award – donated by Civitan Peter Guthrie, this award is presented annually to the Club member who sponsors the most, new members in the year. This recipient sponsored 2 members.

The Membership Award is presented to Civitan Barb Taylor.

Fellowship Award – Donated by former Civitan Rick Eppich, this award is presented annually to the Civitan who best exemplifies good fellowship, ie is the most outgoing, most helpful, most friendly towards his or her fellow members. A vote of the Club membership in August of each year decides who most deserves this award.

The Fellowship Award is presented to **Civitan Mike Keffer**.

The Art Toshack Memorial Award – This award is presented in memory of Civitan Art Toshack to the Civitan judged to have organized the most outstanding public service project during the past year.

The winning project has almost daily activity requiring its members to be "on call" and knowledgeable in the area. It continues to be the best promoter of the Civitan name in our community and its service results in many grateful donations.

*** District Award for Outstanding Community Service – won by Almonte for our Tents program. Thanks to Civitans Paul Cooney and Richard Alexander and their team of about 20 members who set up and took down 68 tents. Their efforts yielded cash donations totalling \$14,000 while at the same time the tents provided at no charge had a donated value of \$7000. The combined value provides assistance within our community of \$21,0000. Would all the those who worked on tents please stand.

Civitan Research Fellowship Award – presented to Civitan Bill Lawrence from Almonte Civitan Club for outstanding service to Civitan. Bill served as our District Governor and then served as International Director for Region 5.

The Lloyd Connolly Memorial Award – presented annually to a member(s) of the Civitan Club who has chaired an event or project worthy of distinction. The recipient will have demonstrated, to a high level, the principals of the Civitan Creed highlighting fellowship and service of Civitan.

The Lloyd Connolly Memorial Award is presented to the chairs of a project that took place 4 days a week for over 4 months. The chairs were engaged every day and filled in when members could not keep their dates. Their dedication helped to raise \$4100 in 2019.

The Lloyd Connolly Memorial Award is presented to **Civitans Don and Ruth Stewart for the Lottery Sales.**

Golden Fine Award – This award is presented to the member deemed to have paid the most fines during the past year. In 2019 the recipient was truly self-deprecating and took a lot on himself.

The Golden Fine Award is presented to **Doug Rice**.

Civitan of the Year – awarded annually to the member providing outstanding service to the Club during the past year. The member must have held an executive position or a leadership position deemed valuable within the club during the past 3 years. The member must have actively participated in at least 3 club projects in the year of the award. The member must have always demonstrated the ideals of Civitan, practicing service, fellowship and knowledge, as judged by the Awards Committee.
